Ethiopia's first gas reserves certificate lures anchor investors

ADDIS ABABA -- With certified seven trillion cubic feet natural gas discovered lately in Ogaden, Ethiopia, is definitely a key to reach out to anochor investors, Fairfax Africa Fund Global Chairperson Zemedeneh Nigatu said.

In his latest interview with international media, Zemedeneh stated that the seven trillion cubic feet natural gas is actually the proven and certified gas reserve. Starting from the Imperial regime, a lot of explorations have been done in Ethiopia, but nothing was really significant, he added.

What the Government of Ethiopia has done smartly this time, according to Zemedeneh, is finding out what exactly does the nation have. The country gets a certified reserve from the American Company with a very good track record of certifying reserves.

As to him, to certify what is there is one step, and the second step is to monetize. A government with such reliable and certified data, it entices investors to proceed. The certification is now attracting sizable amount of credible investors when they see this kind of certified reserve.

Further, Zemedeneh mentioned that now a day, gas price is the main topic in Europe. Countries in Europe are looking for other gas sources. "With seven trillion cubic feet of gas, Ethiopia might be an alternative supplier of gas to Europe. It will be worth tens of billions of dollars over the next decades or more," he said.

In addition, the chairman disclosed that it is a very significant step for Ethiopia regarding monetizing what is in the ground. This might be the first step towards that goal.

In the situation where all the efforts

In the past, there were talks about significant gas and oil available in Ethiopia, but nothing was done. Now, the Government of Ethiopia has taken a smart, radically different approach regarding knowing what the nation has. Ethiopia is going to approach anchor companies not speculators because now the nation has tangible resource, Zemedeneh noted.

Seven trillion cubic feet of gas reserve is amongst 40 largest reserves in the world and rank higher on the list, the chairperson added.

The government of Ethiopia has been restructuring its policies in the past several years to upgrade its potential and to attract investors. This time, the country has something at hand, so that as to the mine minister, they will definitely be dealing with credible players, Zemedeneh said.

Government underscored.

"Therefore, the posture of Ethiopian National Defense Forces (ENDF) remains one of defending the various attacks which have been launched from all directions, together with our people."

Demeke pointed out that the T-TPLF has blocked humanitarian truce through hostile rhetoric, recruiting child soldiers, and engaging in public mobilization planning for yet another round of hostilities.

As the terrorist group has been blaming and demonizing the government and asserting fictitious wins, the government would continue to discharge its constitutional responsibility to safeguard the lives and livelihoods of all Ethiopians as well as defending sovereignty and territorial integrity, he asserted.

"Some groups should stop equating the government with the outlawed terrorist organization and take measures that will worsen the conflict and threaten Ethiopia's sovereignty."

Appreciating the efforts of the countries and humanitarian actors that tried to contribute to prevent another round of bloodshed in Ethiopia, Demeke noted that the government has been disappointed to see and endure the open conspiracy of some actors.

"Ethiopia has implemented a reengagement strategy to reset its relations with several countries. It has registered encouraging progress."

He, however, said some entities and subnational elements have persisted with negative views and few have gone extra miles supporting the TPLF. "Still, others have used their media platform and personal accounts to give their support."

According to him, the worst manifestation of hostility to the government has gone as far as supplying the TPLF with military hardware.

Talking about the renewed war by the terrorist group, Demeke said that the latest wave attacks on the Amhara and Afar areas will not be accepted and the government is committed to taking all necessary steps to prevent the T-TPLF from victimizing these communities.

The government has been taking measures against the terrorist group with utmost care to avoid civilian casualties extending alerts to protect themselves and stay away from military installations, it was learnt.

"The international community is expected to be free, balanced and objective. We called on humanitarian actors to respect principles of impartiality and independence. They should not be used by TPLF for its hostile propaganda."

Mekelle University Former Heritage Conservation and Research Associate Prof. Ayele Bekerie said that the Terrorist group is now carrying out a well coordinated war against the general public.

TPLF: Another assault, another tragedy

Beginning August 24, 2022 the terrorist Tigray People Liberation Front, TPLF, has again opened an attack on multiple fronts against positions in Amhara and Afar regions. A population with more than half needing urgent humanitarian assistance and being served accordingly, TPLF has not hesitated to boldly assault the very nation that is cooperating with international relief agencies to free their people from famine and dire conditions. To add insult to injury the same terrorist force has broken into the headquarters of the World Food Program in Mekelle and robbed twelve trucks of fuel that was meant to facilitate the transport of relief supplies to the needy. This force has stolen the fuel to fill its trucks full of soldiers and other youths who are meant to be cannon fodder in the human wave style they continue to use in this assault.

bodies International must condemned this latest assault by TPLF and yet we have seen their failure in apparent legitimization of the attack. What is more troubling is that this attack by TPLF has come when there were hopes of initiating full-fledged peace talks following the repeated pledges of the Ethiopian government for a peaceful settlement with the regional leaders without any preconditions. The government has also revealed its peace blue print in a document ready for distribution to the relevant bodies engaged in the negotiations and that the AU would be at the head of such negotiations along with a committee of negotiators assigned by the Ethiopian government.

Ethiopia has repeatedly asserted that it is willing to pay every sacrifice if that is the road to peace and wants all its nationals including the ones in Tigray to live in peace. However, since the very conception and formation of TPLF, it is based on a continuous fabrication of an enemy and continuous state of war and consequent preparation of warlike mentality in the psyche of its followers. It has proved once again that it has no space for peace and development of the society, no worries or concerns for the dire poverty in which they live.

TPLF came to power on the manifesto of liberating its people from all forms of oppression and yet once it was at the helm of the federal government beside the regional administration, it has done little to both the country as well as the regional state it has administered for more than three decades. In fact it has administered the region even before the fall of the military government in 1991.

Furthermore, TPLF has maintained its name of foundation to current days despite a total change of conditions along the years. It is perplexing to see a party that was born as a guerilla movement and after all the struggle it has passed through and after it has seized power, it has still remained faithful to its original name, turning a blind eye to the changed reality. And yet along the almost five decades since its inception, things have changed not only domestically but also internationally. So many countries have grown to such levels that one would not recognize them after all this time. If we consider certain Asian countries, they have become super powers in economic terms and their influence in world politics has become enormous. Countries such as China, Japan, India, South Korea, Indonesia, Taiwan, Vietnam and others have changed beyond recognition. Probably TPLF is the only political organisation that has not changed with the same old siege mentality and the same old slogans!

When four years ago the reformist movement deposed them from the federal position, they failed to recognize their defeat and denied the reality. It was another demonstration that TPLF and democracy are two opposite sides. They continued to long for the days in which they were the only force that dominated the country. The protest against its oppressive machinery was meant to have a democratic system, but they insisted with their tyrannical rule. People had enough of TPLF and they were ousted of office. Representing a minority they failed to admit that they could not continue to dominate Ethiopian politics with total negligence of the voices of the people. Hence, TPLF's dictatorial powers were washed away by a wave of protests from practically every corner of the country. But what they preferred to do was to take refuge in the people of the regional state continuing with their propaganda that they were to be subjugated again by Addis Ababa.

TPLF as the regional administrator did nothing to improve the livelihood of the people of Tigray. In more than three decades it failed to address the basic needs of the people. Only a few members of the hierarchy of TPLF and those who had particular attachments to the system were seen navigating in gold while those who actually paid the real sacrifices with their children and themselves have not had any changes in their poor lives. The leaders of TPLF have always used their power to maintain their economic and political monopoly discriminating against all

other Ethiopians. They controlled every echelon of government in every field and took all the benefits such position gave them. In the meantime, they built a huge military and financial apparatus with their ethnic group members at the helm. And yet this condition did not prevent the reformist movement to get rid of them, even if there are still challenges that may come from the remnants of such forces in the Federal positions when the country is battling against this evil force.

When TPLF forces attacked the northern command in November 2020 their intention was to march down to Addis Ababa and restore their forces in the National Palace overthrowing the legitimately elected government. They waged a war of attrition with uncounted losses and came all the way down to the heart of Ethiopia but were then thrown out with immense sacrifices. Along their way they looted every property they found worthy and took to Mekelle and destroyed all that they could not take way. They committed untold atrocities against innocent civilians along their way.

The Federal Government of Ethiopia unilaterally laid down arms so that conditions for peace could be initiated and humanitarian aid be delivered to all those who needed it. And yet TPLF did not take this proposal seriously and rather took time to reorganize its forces and recruit more youths to be thrown into the battlefield. And last August it began another assault on positions in Ethiopia!

Ethiopia has demanded the international community to force TPLF with its influence to abandon the use of force while immense suffering is being experienced among the majority of the six million people trapped by TPLF.

With another round of war against its own people there are bound to be immense casualties for a cause that has no hope. TPLF has shown time and again that it cannot lead its people to peace, justice and development. It had every chance during its thirty year reign but failed. Three decades could have sufficed to transform the Tigrean community if there was some genuine will on the part of the administration, and yet what they did was consolidate their power, increase their wealth and their families' and friends' riches disregarding completely the plight of the common people.

The ordinary people of Tigray are still struggling to make ends meet. Millions of Tigray youths are without hope nor employment and the farmers are still using their horses or oxen to plough the land. And yet they are always asked to contribute their children for their adventurous wars. They continue to feed them with certain narratives and deny them any form of exposure to other sources of information except the official radio and TV channels. Hence the people of Tigray often have little idea about what is going on outside the TPLF circles. They take everything the TPLF forces say as the only truth. And that is very tragic considering the times.

Today with a third round of attacks against Ethiopian positions they are dragging the people of Tigray to yet another round of sacrifices that has served nothing in the first two attacks. It is however good to note that TPLF is not alone in this endeavour. There are historical enemies of Ethiopia who are behind their adventures. There has been proof of their complicity in fighting against Ethiopian forces and this is another dangerous escalation in this contention.

Ethiopians are not new to such complicities. They have lived through it for years. And they have successfully foiled all such coordinated attacks and only recently a huge al shabaab force was demolished in the east when it tried to penetrate the country, and the same was done with the Shene and Gambella rebels in Gambella region. When Ethiopians are united they can beat every enemy whatever the sacrifices.

However, what is tragic is that many international bodies including so called human rights activists are either blind to this reality deliberately or prefer to subscribe to the false narratives of the TPLF propaganda machine. This is clearly seen with their reports on their media channels or when certain governments comment on the reality in Ethiopia particularly in the western corridors of power. TPLF has built various allies during its three decade position in power and it is they who now help them in their propaganda war. But this does not help to find solutions to the current crisis because the loss is too much to bear particularly for the already crisis ridden Tigray society.

Any kind of war is for the moment absolutely unaffordable and it is sad that a country such as Ethiopia which has been following a good development trajectory is once again pulled into the abyss of a useless fratricidal war with its own people with the blessing and conspiracy of certain international actors.

Wheat production and White lies against Ethiopia

the Ethiopian economy Whenever registers significant and notable growth, the agricultural sector makes the highest contribution. Of the total produce, crops take a substantial share out of which wheat stands as the most important cereal crop. It makes a significant contribution to the growth and development of the agricultural sector and to the food security of farmers. With substantial government support to farmers, wheat production and productivity have been rising in the last few years. Despite the wars and civil disorder, Ethiopia has recorded the largest wheat production in sub-Saharan Africa. However, the Western propaganda machine spreads lies related to drought and shortage of food in the country. The West shipped food aid to Ethiopia without being requested. In fact, wheat has been produced by small-scale farmers and by commercial agro-enterprises that use modern techniques of production.

In the past, wheat production and marketing system has been negatively affected by constraints which caused decreasing yield of wheat. However, there were also important opportunities which encouraged wheat production and marketing. Moreover, the attention given to infrastructure, training and awareness given to farmers has helped in boosting wheat production. Ethiopia has been making progress towards the structural transformation of its economy. Such progress has been driven by growth in agricultural productivity that allows the poor farmers to shift from agriculture towards other sectors including local manufacturing, industry and services. The government focuses on transformation that increases the per capita income of farmers thereby reducing and eliminating poverty and hunger.

It is well known that the agriculture sector is the backbone of the Ethiopian economy. It makes a major contribution to the gross domestic product/GDP of the country. Within agriculture, crop production is a major contributor to GDP. Also, livestock rearing is a major subsector of agriculture, which contributes live animals and their produces to the economy. These produces include meat, dairy products, hides and skins, which could be prepared for exports. As foreign exchange earners livestock produces may finance import of manufactured goods, canned food, fertilizers, agricultural machineries and farm implements. It is probably one of the few sectors the outputs of which finance its inputs. In other words, Ethiopia exports, for example, meat to earn foreign exchange with which it imports fertilizers.

According to agricultural experts, coffee, pulses, oilseeds, potatoes, sugarcane, vegetables and cereals are the principal crops grown in Ethiopia. Cereals are the most important food crop which provides daily food calories to the people. Hence, cereal production and marketing are the means of livelihood for millions of Ethiopians. Wheat, maize, teff, sorghum and barley are the major cereals that occupy a large segment of the total area cultivated. Consumers spend

a major part of their income for purchasing cereals. Of the total grain produced in Ethiopia, cereals account for a large share of the produce. Wheat is an important industrial and food grain which ranks second among the most important cereal crops in the world after rice and traded internationally.

The Prosperity Party/PP and government of Ethiopia focus on wheat as a strategic commodity which generates farm income and improves food security status. Many African countries are producing wheat for both consumption and sale, but the level of production and sale varied between countries. Ethiopia is one of the largest wheat producers in terms of total wheat area cultivated and total production (CSA). As noted by Anteneh and Dr. Asrat, wheat and wheat products represent a major share of the total calorie intake in the country which makes wheat one of the most important food items. In Ethiopia, wheat ranks fourth after teff, maize and sorghum in area coverage and third after maize and teff in total production

Studies indicate that the smallholder production of wheat is mainly for subsistence and less for market. It is produced by both smallholder farmers and large-scale commercial farms. Except some large-scale and commercial farms, wheat is produced predominantly by smallholder farmers under rain fed conditions. This modality of production affects the competitiveness of wheat quality at the global level. Having realized this problem, the current Ethiopian government has embarked on an agricultural strategy that improves wheat production and productivity. This strategy promotes export

of wheat after having satisfied domestic consumption. It definitely replaces imports thereby saving foreign exchange and it helps earn foreign exchange by exporting wheat.

It is the intent of the Ethiopian government to encourage wheat production for both the domestic and external markets. It has helped technically in the import of agricultural tools, implements, tractors, combine harvesters as well as training for operators. It also facilitated agricultural investment that contributes to high yield thereby satisfying domestic and external markets. In this endeavor focus has been given to the highlands of the central, south-eastern and northwest parts of the country which are the main wheat-growing zones of Ethiopia. In the country, wheat grain is used in the preparation of different traditional as well as modern processed food products and other industrial processed products like pasta and macaroni. Also, wheat straw is traditionally used as a roofing material and as animal feed.

Wheat is one of the most vital cereal crops, the production and marketing of which should be given policy direction and close attention by the government of Ethiopia. It is an essential stable and cash crop that increases income, food security, employment and agriculture sector GDP. However, studies indicate that its production and marketing is challenged by factors such as shortage of agricultural inputs, infestation of pests and diseases. It is also seriously affected by shortage of infrastructure, institutional services, storage facilities, product quality and low marketing price. However, there are also opportunities such as the policy of the Ethiopian government, expansion of market and increasing demand for wheat. Also, the potential for wheat production encourages producers and traders to engage in its production and marketing activities.

Research has been conducted on wheat in different parts of Ethiopia. The output of such a research work has to be reviewed and documented for reference by policymakers, researchers and others who are interested in wheat. Particularly, a review of value chain analysis would help to identify challenges and opportunities in wheat production, distribution and marketing in the country. Also, analysis of the impact of climate change on wheat production is of great value. Currently, the Ethiopian government is giving proper attention for the facilitation of production and marketing at home and abroad. Wheat serves as an instrument to reduce and eliminate hunger and poverty. Wheat also saves and earns foreign exchange through reducing its imports and enhancing its exports.

Observers have indicated that little has been done in reviewing research works on wheat in the country. It is, therefore, important to review them to identify gaps and give future directions on production, productivity and marketing of wheat. The overall objective of such a review is to assess wheat production and marketing in Ethiopia. It should specifically review wheat production status, marketing constraints and opportunities in the country. Constraints are the main reasons for the low development of the wheat sector

in the past. On the other hand, opportunities are a means for increasing production, productivity and marketing of wheat. Wheat production and productivity in Ethiopia is the pillar for the growth of the Ethiopian agriculture. The agricultural sector, in turn, has contributed to the development of the country's economy.

Sustained growth in wheat production depends on modern technology supported by agricultural extension services. The extension structure extends from the federal to regions and to Woredas where the main drivers are stationed. In the production system, commodities like crops, pulses, oilseeds, vegetables and fruits are produced annually. Crops make the largest contribution to total production and area coverage (CSA). Crop production has the highest share in the Ethiopian gross domestic product. Among the types of crops, cereals are the most important which provides food calories in day-to-day life of the people. To strengthen their life and to change their living standards, people use various livelihood strategies. Thus, cereal, in particular wheat, production and marketing are the backbone of the Ethiopian economy.

According to agriculture experts, there is a significant annual variation in small scale wheat production due to variability in rainfall. When the rainfall is insufficient, it leads to low production. Despite good production and productivity trends, Ethiopia has faced a growing deficit in supply due to increase in demand caused by the high growth rate of population. Even if it shows increasing trend domestically, wheat production by small scale farmers is still relatively small by global standards. To increase the demand of wheat domestically and globally, the current government has given tremendous support to small farmers and large-scale commercial investors. As a result there will be a glut in wheat production, which may be exported in the very near future.

Experts believe that wheat can be produced in almost all regions of the country including pastoral and agro-pastoral areas. Bale and Arsi zones are the main wheat-growing areas and are known as the wheat belt of Ethiopia. However, wheat production and marketing face constraints despite its major share in rural employment, agricultural land use, calorie intake and contribution to national income. Wheat is one of the most important staple crops of the country in terms of production and consumption. However, Ethiopia still imports millions of quintals of wheat annually. There are two main reasons for the import of wheat into the country. The first is to stabilize domestic price and the second is to meet the overgrowing wheat demand of the consumer in the country. The current government of Ethiopia has been making efforts in the last few years to mechanize wheat farming and produce for both the domestic and external markets. Such a strategy encourages both saving and earning of foreign exchange in the country. Such efforts defeat the Western propaganda against Ethiopia as a starving country. They shipped wheat to Ethiopia which has been rejected by the government.

STEM Synergy strives for hands-on knowledge in Al, coding & robotics

Set to advancing social entrepreneurship

STEM Synergy is striving to help improve quality of education in the science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) fields so that trainers can acquire practical skill in addition to the theoretical knowledge given in the general education.

STEM Synergy is a US-based non-profit organization that has been working to promote quality education, technology transfer and social enterprises that benefit youth and women through hands-on technologies and innovation that solve real problems of the society says Asegedech Shawl, the country representative of STEM during an exclusive interview with The Ethiopian Herald this week.

The main objective of STEM Synergy is to enable students acquire an hands on knowledge and creating enabling platform to enhance knowledge and skill that can alleviate the country's challenges at large excelling at the vicinities level where the STEM centers are operating, according to STEM Synergy project manager, Abiyot Habtemariam.

"Those who are interested to pursue in the area through these platforms can invent technologies, adopt from abroad appropriately and they can produce those technologies in Ethiopia so that they can solve community problems. So, STEM is established in the sense of quality education in the areas of science and technology."

Abiot added; STEM is working to produce STEM work forces in the country not only in developing in line with these areas; but also it has been able so far to operate 22 STEM centers in Ethiopia and transferred to be operated by the higher public institutions. Some are still in preparatory and high schools to address the problems

in the students.

The country manager noted that students can be selected based on their performance because the STEM student's centers can only accommodate few students in order to focus on quality, have a good student's facilities ratio in terms of equipping labs in the ICT field.

Furthermore to expand developing STEM workforce, STEM is working to establish social enterprises in the country. STEMs intention is to create jobs based on solutions. Transferring technologies, creating social enterprising and give opportunities for the women and those economically powerless segments of the society, is the other goal.

STEM has been entered in to the viable and

suitable technologies in the country because there is untapped potential in the sector. Recently, STEM initiated a project (solar project going to be transferred to the youth and women.

"In doing so, there limitations induced even from the global financial crisis, in terms of securing resources."

As a solution, STEM is trying to fix the endless pitfall of depending in foreign donors. Thus, STEM is striving to engage in the business modality parallel to the charitable activities Abiot stated adding that this will increase its reach out to benefit students in terms of acquiring quality education so that it will be translated in to social enterprising.

To this end, STEM has been started fabricating solar bakery technologies to be transferred to the potential entrepreneurs. So far STEM has transferred such machines to the women beneficiaries in the Afar region in terms of long term loan taking in to account that the beneficiaries can't pay the whole cost of the machinery (transfer cost, training cost and related). It is the form of long term loan, he added.

This will be expanded to the solar focused projects (solar energy, irrigation). These projects are earmarked and are now in the pipeline in the business angle to back the charity work.

STEM's intervention includes innovation which focuses on a new solution and idea to improvement the life condition of the community and solving existing problems. In addition, creating an impact, sustainability, scalability, inclusion and affordability are among the major focus areas.

Abiot added that the first batch of the coding and robotics training so far has invented some projects with the objective of

alleviating problems. From now on the pilot projects in the headquarters based in Addis Ababa will be replicated through expanding artificial intelligence, robotics and coding as per STEM's vision.

Demeke Temesgen is a graduate of the Addis Ababa Science and Technology University in Mechanical Engineering parallel to his software development, robotics and coding studies from various institutions. He also studied artificial intelligence (AI) and data science. Demeke is now working with STEM Synergy as trainer of robotics and coding.

The main goal of this training is to offer practical knowledge to the trainees on how to change the theoretical knowledge of chemistry, physics and mathematics in to practical skill, Demeke says.

In the first step when people hear about robotics, there is some sort of confusion. However, after the training, students are able to acquire on how to translate it in to practical knowledge, according to the trainer. It is very interesting field; students stay for so long hours and do not want to stop doing it after they start the practice.

Samuel Werash and Nahom Solomon are both preparatory school students from the Lideta Catholic Cathedral School. "The training provided for us by STEM is helpful to get familiarized with robotics and coding subjects. I believe in my real life, it will help me to make big difference in achieving my dreams of becoming software engineer," says Samuel.

For his part, Nahom says that they have been able to develop three projects (Vehicles controlling technology, ATM machine and traffic light) after the exposure. Nahom, asked about his dreams says "I wish to be aerospace engineer."

The document obtained from the Ministry of Health reveals that in 2015, the Government of Ethiopia made a high level fifteen-year commitment to end stunting in children less than two years by 2030. This commitment, known as the Seqota Declaration (SD), is operationalized through a multisectoral program involving nine different sector ministries, including Ministries of Health; Agriculture; Education; Water, Irrigation and Energy; Women and Social Affairs, Transport and Finance, Labor and Social Affairs and Culture and Tourism.

The SD has a 15-year roadmap divided into three phases: Innovation, Expansion and Scale-Up phases. It envisioned seeing Ethiopian children being free from malnutrition with a goal to end stunting in children under two by 2030.

And its mission is working to end stunting in Ethiopia for children less than two years through effective coordination and collaboration of sectors, communities and development partners, focusing on high impact nutrition specific and nutrition sensitive interventions and social behavior change communications with special consideration for cross-cutting issues such as gender mainstreaming, environment and integrated community development approaches.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Demeke Mekonnen said recently the collaborated efforts being carried out to avert stunting by improving the nutrition system of the country have been registering promising results.

"The Government of Ethiopia has been making a high level fifteenyear commitment to end stunting in children less than two years by 2030. This commitment is being implemented through a multi-sectoral program involving nine different sector ministries," he noted on the impact assessment of Seqota Declaration held in Seqota Town, Amhara State in the presence of ministers of relevant ministries and pertinent stakeholders.

During the occasion, Deputy Premier Demeke, who is also the Patron of the Seqota Declaration, said the problem of stunting has been observed on many children in several parts of Ethiopia noting that comparatively the challenge is rampant in Tekeze basin and the surrounding areas. "The federal government has been working to address the problem by designing a strategy."

According to him, promising outcomes have been registered in the efforts so far undertaken in a collaborated manner to overcome stunting by improving the nutrition system of the country.

"The success story which had been achieved in the four year performance of the innovation phase of the declaration need to be scaled up in the expansion phase of Seqota Declaration which was launched in August 2021 and will be implemented in 240 Woredas," he added.

Considering the strong partnership and effective contribution of development partners during the innovation phase (2018 to 2021), Demeke urged all stakeholders to contribute their part for the successful implementation of Expansion Phase in preventing child death and averting stunting.

The impact assessment report presented during the meeting indicated that Sekota Declaration intervention has shown remarkable progress in reducing stunting cases and child death. As indicated in the report, stunting of children less than two years of age has been reduced by three percent at the national level.

The increased coverage of agricultural production, health services, social behavior change communication, water, sanitation and hygiene interventions have contributed to the observed success- reduction of stunting cases and child deaths.

As well, the assessment report stated that improved complementary feeding was the primary driver to reducing stunting.

Consequently, the assessment report recommended that respective ministries in agriculture, health, education, water and energy, social protection and women, irrigation, transport, culture and tourism, finance, innovation and technology have to add efforts and work together with the development partners to achieve the goal of Seqota Declaration to end stunting.

The *Buhe* celebration is more known is Menz, Gondar, Wollo, South Gondar (Debre Tabor) and Addis Ababa, he said. As to him, the registration of this cultural celebration as a national heritage will have a significant socio-economic roles.

The expert told this writer that the registration and conservation of the country's diversified intangible and tangible cultural heritages is important to promote the country's tourism sector through building the national image among the international community.

Moreover, the City Administration Culture and Tourism Bureau in collaboration with pertinent stakeholders facilitate the platform to celebrate the day through keeping the original cultural ceremonial process





annually.

Thus, celebrating the day in such colorful manner helps the new generation learn more from the country's cultural assets, and to maintain its cultural aspects without losing values, he emphasized.

"Currently, the new generation is playing an important role in preserving and celebrating such cultural holidays through inheriting and keeping our forefather's/foremother's cultural wisdom and arts. It is the right time to utilize the immense potentials of cultural heritages through promoting via the social and mainstream media," he said.

On his part, Debre Tabor University President Anegagregn Gashaw (PhD) said that Buhe festivity signifies new hope and togetherness among celebrants of the festival.

On the celebration, Minister of Industry Melaku Alebel said that conserving and developing the country's diversified cultural values will have significant socio-economic contributions.

During the celebration of the 4th round *Buhe* festival at Debre Tabor Mountain Eyesus Church, Minister Melaku said that the Ministry of Tourism and its subsequent

offices should fulfill their responsibilities of promoting the country's ancient cultural and religious values to the rest of the world.

As to him, promoting the cultural values successfully will have an indispensable role in supporting the country's endeavors to register a sustainable socio-economic growth.

"Our forefathers/mothers sacrificed a lot to inherit us these unique, essential values. To this end, tourism bureaus, concerned institutions including the society should exert their responsibility to promote and preserve these values," he said.
